HOW TO APPLY:

Apply online at dss.sc.gov to complete a SFMNP online application from **May 5th thru May 25th**.

You may qualify to receive \$25 worth of coupons
to buy fresh fruits and vegetables
from authorized farmers this summer!

HOW TO QUALIFY:

- Must be a low-income senior aged 60 or older
- Have a valid driver's license or state issued ID (*must be presented to pick up*)
- Live in a participating county
