For nearly 30 years, Respite Care Charleston has been the only local nonprofit providing support and services to the thousands of families living with Alzheimer's disease and other forms of dementia in Charleston County. Most services are free, and scholarships are available to ensure no family is ever denied help due to financial constraints.



Caregiver Support Groups

RCC professionals facilitate 10+ support group meetings each month at locations throughout Charleston and online, offering the chance to share experiences, problem-solve, learn about and prepare for what's to come, and connect with community resources and other caregivers.

Senior Moments

Designed for people with mild cognitive impairment or early-stage dementia, this unique program helps members understand their condition, prepare for the future, and build relationships with others who share their journey.

Individual Caregiver Consultations

In person or on the phone, these discussions offer free education on symptoms and disease progression, risk management tips (legal and financial protections, physical safeguards, etc.), guidance for short- and long-term considerations, help trouble-shooting challenges, and ongoing personal support.

Half-Day Memory Care (Respite)
