Genetics of Normal Aging

How each of us ages is the result of a complex set of circumstances that include genetics that we inherit from our parents, "somatic" genetic changes over time, and the environment. Not even identical twins are truly 100% identical.

How long each of us will live, what we look like as we age, how we sense things, how we think about and plan things, how easy it is for us to "get sick," and how well we are able to respond to medications over time which our doctors prescribe are all affected by both genetics and the environment. The purpose of these talks would be to have us better understand how genetics and the environment are involved in normal aging.

Ruth K. Abramson, is Clinical Professor, Department of Neuropsychiatry and Behavioral Sciences at the University of South Carolina School of Medicine. Dr. Abramson is a PhD medical geneticist and founding fellow of the American College of Medical Genetics with a long time interest and extensive research in the role of genetics and the environment.

She received both her graduate and undergraduate degrees from Winthrop University in Rock Hill, SC. Her research interests are centered around diabetes in pregnancy and diabetes prevention.

History of Glenn Springs, SC

Discover a little-known slice of South Carolina history in Glenn Springs! "The Glenn Springs Company" a grand hotel that opened in July 1836, quickly became known for its elegance, gentility, and the prominence of its guests. Where opulence was the standard, it became known as the unofficial capital of South Carolina because of the judges, US senators, representatives, and officials who spent summers with their families at Glenn Springs, enjoying the spring water known as the "true Elixir of Life." The course explores the migration of Scots and Scots-Irish into upstate South Carolina and the impact they had, hotels and resorts in South Carolina during the 1800s, and the importance of rail-ways to the financial health of the state.

David Gregg Hodges has been in the life insurance business with MassMutual for 45 years. He is married to Susan Graybill Hodges for 47 years, with four children and nine grandchildren. His 2019 book "Sunset Lodge in Georgetown, the Story of a Madam", explores the history of the famous Georgetown County brothel, the Sunset Lodge. The world has changed dramatically since the end of the Second World War, experiencing decolonization, the end of the "cold War", extraordinary economic development, the growth of technology and communications, and improvements in health care, poverty and education. However, issues such as energy dependence, climate change, terrorism, heightened nationalism, human rights, authoritarianism and the use of brute force command headlines and threaten to derail our collective progress. In four sessions, we will look at the shifting political and economic landscape in Africa, the Americas, Asia and Europe. We will also consider the forces and factors that are impacting and changing the World Order, such as Globalization, Trade and Aid, Climate Change, Media, Ideology, and more, *Dr. Morris "Moss" Blachman is a Distinguished Clinical Professor Emeritus, U of SC. Moss taught Latin American politics, U.S. foreign policy and international relations in U of SC's politics department for 23 years, then 24 years as Associate Dean for Continuous Professional Development and Strategic affairs for the USC School of Medicine. Moss received his Ph.D. from New York University, his MA from U of SC and his BA from Brandeis University. He also served as an intelligence officer in the United States Air force, including a tour in Vietnam for which he was awarded the Bronze Star.*
